

Silver Lake Park Campground & Cabins Rules & Regulations

Campsites **CHECK-IN** 1pm-7pm **CHECK-OUT** 11am

Cabins **CHECK-IN** 3pm-7pm **CHECK-OUT** 11am

All children must be at their campsite from 10pm to 8am

Speed Limit 5mph throughout the campground. Enter and Exit with caution. Children can be anywhere. All roads are ONE WAY.

Waterfront NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY **You and your guests swim at your own risk.** Parents are responsible for their children at all times. No child under 15 is allowed in the water without supervision. No swimming before dawn and after sunset. **No diving from any dock, raft, boat at any time, the water is very shallow.** Never swim alone. No Glass on the beach. Life jackets are required for all watercraft.

One Vehicle is allowed at each site. Extra cars, boat trailers, etc. must be parked in the conveniently located VISITOR or BOAT PARKING area.

Quiet Time is 10PM-8AM Sunday – Thursday and 11PM-8AM Friday and Saturday. Please be considerate of your neighbors. Radios and Televisions shall not be heard beyond your site. No loud gatherings/parties. Noise level is measured by how it affects your neighbors. If it is too loud for them, it is too loud for us.

Campfires shall be confined to the provided fire rings and must be under control. Use proper campfire wood, never burn pressure treated/painted wood. Extinguish the fire before leaving the site or retiring for the night. All fires must be out by midnight. Do not throw trash, glass, cans, etc. into the fire rings. Do not cut or break tree branches for your fire. Firewood and fire starters are available at the office/store.

Alcohol is allowed at campsites only, must be 21. Alcohol is not allowed in any common areas. When alcohol is present all children under age 21 must be accompanied by a parent/guardian, it's the NH State Law.

Water Usage Please conserve water, we are on a private well. DO NOT wash cars or RVs.

Never flush disposable wipes, diapers or feminine products into sewer. Never pour grease into the sewer.

Children Parents are responsible for children at all times. Special awareness should be observed. Please respect neighboring campsites/property.

Bicycles No riding after dusk. Bikes are allowed on the outer road and dirt road, but are not allowed on the inner campground roads for safety reasons, inner campground roads are too steep and have blind spots. For the safety of your child helmets are recommended.

Motorized Scooters, ATVs, Golf Carts and any like motorized transporter are prohibited.

Site Occupancy is based on a family of 2 adults and 2 children under 18. Maximum occupancy is 6 persons per site, 4 adults maximum. Visitors/guests must visit when you are here and cannot occupy your site in your absence. Person renting site must be 25 years old for a cabin or 21 years old for RV sites.

Boats All watercraft must be registered with the campground, boat fees apply. Mooring spots are available on a first come-serve basis, otherwise boats shall be trailered when not in use. Canoes and kayaks shall be stored at the waterfront in the designated area or at your campsite., there may or may not be room on the racks. Life jackets must be worn/available in accordance with state laws, available at camp office. Our rentals must first be signed out before use.

Pets No dogs/pets allowed (there are many nice campgrounds that allow dogs, please respect that we do not).

Dumpster/Recycling is for household trash only and is located on the exit road for your convenience. A large sink in the laundry is provided for your **Dishwashing**.

Visitors must sign in before entering the campground, fees apply. Visitors are your responsibility. We offer several visitor packages, sign up at the office. We reserve the right to limit the number and frequency of guests at your site.

Fireworks and Firearms of any kind are not allowed.

Insurance is required for your vehicles, trailer and motorized boats while on campground property. Silver Lake Park Campground & Cabins is not responsible for loss or theft of any kind or damages caused by natural causes: tree falling, branches, food loss due to power issues. All activities are done of your own free will and any injury or loss is at your own risk.
